On Tuesday 19 March pupils will take part in their second annual PSHE day at Lynn Grove Academy. Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education is a school subject through which pupils develop the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to manage their lives, now and in the future. These skills and attributes help pupils to stay healthy, safe and prepare them for life and work in modern Britain. PSHE education helps pupils to thrive as individuals, family members and members of society. From making responsible decisions about alcohol to succeeding in their first job, PSHE education helps pupils to manage many of the most critical opportunities, challenges and responsibilities they will face growing up.

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Therefore, it is extremely important that students are in school on this day in order to learn and develop these skills. Year 8 will take part in a number of activities including keeping yourself safe, British values, healthy eating and relationships. They will also have a presentation from the Police about ways in which they can keep themselves safe from harm online and in general. Pupils will need to come to school wearing school PE kit on the day and will not be required to wear school uniform at any point during the day.
